



19th Century Masterfile Update

ARTstor content to be indexed within 19th Century Masterfile

Paratext announces that hundreds of thousands of citations from the *ARTstor Digital Library* will be indexed and integrated into Paratext's *19th Century Masterfile* database, allowing historians and scholars from many disciplines to expand their art history research.

The *ARTstor Digital Library* is a nonprofit resource that provides more than one million digital images in the arts, architecture, humanities, and sciences. The Digital Library serves educators, scholars, curators, librarians, and students at more than 1,350 universities, community colleges, museums, libraries, and K-12 schools in 45 countries worldwide. The ARTstor collections—as well as their proprietary suite of software tools—support teaching and research in art, architecture, music, religion, anthropology, literature, world history, American Studies, Classical Studies, Medieval Studies, Renaissance Studies, and more.

Thousands of New Links to Full Text Sources

Paratext has recently deployed over 2.5 million links to *HathiTrust* within *19th Century Masterfile*. Paratext has also added substantially more links from *19th Century Masterfile* to Readex's Congressional Serial Set, bringing the total links within this area to more than 238,000. Overall, the total number of full text resources in *19th Century Masterfile* exceeds 19 million.

Index to the *Farmers' Bulletin* (1889-1939)

The *Farmer's Bulletin* was for many years the most valuable resource available to farmers and other agriculturalists. All pamphlets produced from 1889 to 1939 are now included.

Indexes to the *Congressional Globe* (1833-1873), *Annals of Congress* (1789-1824) and *Register of Debates* (1824-1837)

Included in Series V, these join the index to the *Journals of the Continental Congress* (1774-1789) to ensure that *19th Century Masterfile* provides primary source Congressional coverage from the Continental Congress in 1774 to the 39th Congress in 1867.

Comprehensive Index to the Publications of the United States Government (Ames)

This valuable resource, now included in Series V, provides an alphabetical subject listing for Congressional and departmental publications from 1881-1893.

Galloupe's General Index to Engineering Periodicals

This addition includes more than 100,000 citations from engineering resources published between 1183-1893. This addition provides a valuable adjunct to many technical titles not represented in the other periodical indexes within Series I.

Index to General Periodical Literature (Cotgreave)

Planned as an "inexpensive alternative to *Poole's Index*", this brings in new books and periodicals from 1850-1899, adding more than 52,000 citations from Series I.

Records of the U.S. Congressional Serial Set (*Readex*)

A vast cache of primary source research materials related to the key events of American history, more than 238,000 citations from 1817-1930 are now in Series V of *19th Century Masterfile*.
